SEASONAL VACCINATIONS

It's important to get your winter flu and COVID-19 vaccinations if you're eligible. Getting vaccinated every year will top up your protection and reduce your risk of getting severe symptoms.

You can get both the flu and COVID-19 vaccines if you;

- are aged 65 or over (including those who will be 65 by 31st March 2025)
- have certain health conditions
- are pregnant
- live in a care home for older adults

Other care home residents, carers and people who live with someone who has a weakened immune system can get the flu vaccine. Frontline health and social care workers can also get flu and COVID-19 vaccines.

PHARMACY CONSULTATIONS

You can contact or visit your local community pharmacy for help and advice from a qualified healthcare professional, on a range of minor illnesses, including;

- earache
- impetigo
- infected insect bites
- shingles
- sinusitis
- sore throat
- urinary tract infections (UTIs)

If something is more serious, they can point you to the right place to contact or attend. They can also offer confidential advice on a range of topics, including exercise, stopping smoking, contraception, skin issues, blood pressure and more.

They can also support you with taking medication, and any queries you may have.

MY PLANNED CARE

If you are waiting for a referral appointment, *My Planned Care* gives you advice and support whilst you wait, and helps you to prepare for your hospital consultation, treatment, or surgery.

This includes giving you information about waiting times for your hospital, and information about supporting and local services while you wait. Waiting time information is not applicable for patients on a cancer pathway.
